Catalyst Evolve Award (2016-2019) General information

Our activities over the first two years of this award scheme from Arts Council England have proved successful, and have led to several new funding streams and raised awareness of our activities beyond our existing networks. In addition to our funding from ACE as a National Portfolio Organisation, and grants raised from other public and academic funds, we set a target, to be matched funded by ACE, of £70,000 by July 2019. We are very pleased to report that during the first two years of the scheme we will have managed to achieve this target.

New partnerships included working with the Freedom Festival in Hull on *Beyond Words*, a series of commissioned publications, residencies, and exhibitions in libraries and special collections across the city – including artists Lubaina Himid, Ruth Ewan, Helen Cammock, Hannah Dawn Henderson amongst others, and funded by the James Reckitt Library Trust. Artists' publications with Slavs and Tatars and Bouchra Khalili have attracted funding from their commercial galleries: Galerie Polaris, Paris; ADN Galeria, Barcelona; Raster Foundation, Warsaw; Third Line, Dubai; Tanya Bonakdar, New York; and Kraupa Tuskansy Zeidler, Berlin - a relatively new source of funding for us and one that we hope will bring more international exposure and readership.

Campaigns have included a successful Kickstarter for *Upcycle This Book* by Gavin Wade, bringing advance orders on the book as part of the rewards, and wide publicity for this new title. Our *Blinded by Love* Raffle was also hugely successful, with prizes donated by Tacita Dean, Slavs & Tatars, Douglas Gordon, Broomberg & Chanarin - all artists with whom we've worked. The 'print edition' raffle ticket by Broomberg & Chanarin meant everyone won a prize in the form of an editioned print. The venue for the evening was kindly provided by Hollybush Gardens. We are planning our next raffle party event for November 2018 to build on this model.

Also new for Book Works, are the Book Club events held at Holywell Row, to attract new supporters and offer existing ones a chance to get to know Book Works, our trustees, and the artists, writers, editors and designers we work with, more closely. The first three events have been with: Katrina Palmer (artist) and Lisa Le Feuvre (curator and writer) - offering an insight into the processes involved in Katrina's work as a writer and sculptor; Mark Dion (artist) in conversation with Gilda Williams (writer, editor and critic) talking about his new show at the Whitechapel Gallery, and the reprint of his book *Bureau of the Centre for Study of Surrealism and its Legacy* published by Book Works; and Book Works director Rob Hadrill talking about the Studio practice, designing and producing work for artists such as Douglas Gordon, Beatrice Milhazes, Damien Hirst etc., and talking with Michael Mack, publisher and Director of MACK art and photography books.

For the third year of Catalyst we hope to build on these new initiatives and publicise our programme in order to raise awareness of what we do, and how people might get involved in supporting our organisation. We aim to set new targets and to plan for the legacy of this award and future directions for development at Book Works.

Catalyst Evolve Project Coordinator for Book Works (18 months fixed term post)

Book Works received a Catalyst Evolve Award from Arts Council England (ACE) to enable us to diversify our funding streams, particularly to seek out new supporters, trusts and foundations, through crowdfunding initiatives, special events, and networking, and to raise our profile as an art publisher commissioning an ambitious programme of artists' publications and projects.

ACE is match funding any money we raise, pound by pound, up to £70,000 over 3 years (August 2016 – July 2019).

Book Works has a Catalyst Development team made up of Book Works staff and trustees focused on developing our new integrated fundraising strategy as well as how we promote Book Works to potential supporters and new audiences.

We are now over halfway through the project and are looking for a new project coordinator to help us with this fundraising initiative, to coordinate the scheme and help publicise Book Works, and to provide administrative support for Book Works Catalyst Development team.

Job Specification

This job will offer an opportunity to work as part of our team here at Book Works, and would be suitable for someone who already has some experience of fundraising and publicity in the arts sector, and who would like to support the development of a small arts organisation.

Book Works has an Equal Opportunities policy and welcomes applications from all sections of society particularly BAME applicants.

You will:

- Work closely with our Directors Jane Rolo and Rob Hadrill; Editorial and Marketing Development Manager Gavin Everall, as well as our Catalyst Development team chaired by Reema Khan (trustee) who will be meeting regularly to develop this project.
- You will manage information input and updates in our Supporters' database and assist us in the development of the database itself.
- You will help manage and develop relationships with potential funders, and assist with applications to trusts and foundations.
- Coordinate communications, including news and event updates, with existing supporters, and organise our Book Club events for supporters.
- Assist with publicity and promotional campaigns, reaching out through press/media contacts, mail-outs and social media networks, as well as helping

with crowdfunding campaigns and special fundraising events such as our annual raffle to be held in November 2018.

- Attend all relevant meetings, take minutes and circulate updates as necessary, co-ordinating actions and targets decided on.
- Have the opportunity to join some of our specialist training sessions at Book Works.

- We are looking for someone who has a good general knowledge of contemporary visual arts.

- Someone who has interest in contemporary/independent art book publishing.
- Experience of how supporters' schemes work for charities would be advantageous, and has contacts in press/media to help build up our profile to potential supporters and customers for our books.
